GENERAL REPORT

As required, this report covers the period from 1st October 2021 until 30th September 2022. The report thus refers to the second half of the 2021/2022 Haughley WI Programme (1st October 2021 to 31st March 2022 and the first half of the 2022/23 Haughley WI Programme (1st April 2022 to 30th September 2022.) The "Covid effect" has forced us to take stock of who we are and what we do. We are actively trying to recruit more members and to increase the range of member activities, their participation in decision-making and running of Haughley WI. At the same time, we are working hard to become financially resilient. So, we have lots to do.

Haughley WI continues to hold its Members' general meetings in the Village Hallon the first Wednesday every month, when Members celebrating a birthday on or around that time are presented with a card and small gift. November 2022 our Committee was re-elected without change and continues meeting regularly to plan monthly meetings, other events and to ensure continued support for our membership. Committee meetings are held in Officers' homes whenever possible, but to ensure continuity, occasional virtual meetings via Zoom have been arranged by our President. October 2021 to March 2022 meetings were held in strict accordance with covid guidance of the day, with special emphasis on enhanced ventilation, face coverings, hand hygiene, use of furniture and facilities and member movements. The use of face coverings is now optional and has been abandoned by most members, which has enhanced social interactions, both at meetings and during other events.
